Dear I.S. 237 Students, Parents/Guardians:

Welcome to Rachel Carson Intermediate School 237! We are delighted that you will be coming to our school and we look forward to greeting you in person at 8:00 A.M. on Thursday, September 8th. Below, you will find a brief summary of some of our school policies as well as a list of supplies you will need to get off to a great start this year.

SCHOOL HOURS

Our school hours are Monday through Friday 8:00 AM to 2:20 PM.
You will receive information about our after school programs when school starts.

TRANSPORTATION

Students who are eligible for school bus transportation (yellow bus) will be notified about pick-up and drop-off times and locations before school starts. Students who are eligible to receive a NYC Metro Card will be notified as well. Please note that students are not permitted to receive both yellow bus transportation and a Metro Card.

DRESS CODE

All students must wear the uniform school shirt daily. Shirts are color-coded by grade (Grade 6 – maroon; Grade 7 – green; Grade 8 – grey). Girls may wear skirts of an appropriate length, khaki slacks or black jeans. Boys may wear khaki slacks or black jeans. Sneakers or other closed shoes are permitted.

For your convenience, shirts will be available for purchase before the first day of school, in Room 109 as follows:

Tuesday, August 30 th	9:00 AM to 12:00 PM
Thursday, September 1 st	9:00 AM to 12:00 PM
Wednesday, September 7 th	11:00 AM to 2:00 PM

Physical Education teachers will provide students with all necessary information about gym uniforms.

Students are NOT permitted to wear

- jeans of any color other than black; jeans with rips or cut-out holes
- low-slung (sagging) pants
- sweat pants
- pajama-type clothing
- T shirts, tank tops or midriff revealing shirts/blouses
- sandals, flip flops or other footwear that may cause a safety hazard
- outer clothing – hoodies, coats, jackets, gloves, scarves, hats (with the exception of head coverings in accordance with religious customs or beliefs)
- jewelry such as excessively large hoop earrings or inappropriate facial jewelry

Our School Dress Code is strictly enforced!
