Open Photoshop then go to File Open and find the 1-Angkor-Wat.jpg on your desktop

2. Select Image > Image Size a window should appear

What information about the image do you get from this window?

What do you notice when you try to force the size of the image?

Why do you think this happening?

How can we correct this?
